

News from the Board of Directors

Dear neighbors,

At our October Meeting the Board of Directors reviewed each budget line item and worked on developing the well-planned budget for our projected 2024 needs. Since the May Annual meeting, we have reduced water costs by repairing the pool leaks, reduced landscaping costs by changing landscaping companies and by having an active Grounds and Maintenance team to oversee areas of concern. All spendings have been audited and costs cut where possible. Banking has been reviewed to get the best return on our banking accounts. With all these changes and improvements, the board was able to move money within our budget for 2024. We were able to increase the reserves by \$9224.00. All of this is achieved without an assessment increase.

We are working on our improvement plans for the next 3 years. Using allocated reserves, the plan has started for pool deck, parking lot improvements and resurfacing of the Basketball courts and tennis courts in 2024. Landscaping plans are in sight for early 2024 for the entrances,

The board is also working on setting the standards for future repairs and putting a maintenance schedule in place to assist this board, management and future boards for costs and planning.

The best place to understand what your HOA board of directors does for you and to bring your concerns is by attending our monthly meetings. The current board has monthly meetings with Zoom meeting for two months then one in- person meeting in the clubhouse. Agenda for these meetings are posted two days prior to the meeting in the clubhouse Bulletin board.

Our website should be active by December 1st, we will be sending an eblast through Sentry to announce the launch of the website. This website is being monitored through a webmaster account and will keep current information for events and announcements. Clubhouse Rental bookings and Architectural Applications will be available through the website. (continued on page 2).

Our Compliance Committee has been on standby to start the fining process of Violations in final status. We will be launching our ability to fine daily for infractions that are not being corrected in Dec or Jan. If anyone is on a final notice at this time, the fining hearing will be setting up hearings after the monthly board meetings. It is important that homeowners quickly comply with violations to avoid this process. This new procedure will allow the board and management to enforce the rules while avoiding going straight to the attorney for compliance.

The best place to find out what the Board is doing and what's happening at Deer Creek is to attend our monthly meeting. We have two consecutive Zoom meetings followed by an in-person meeting. <u>Our next meeting</u> is December 14 by Zoom call.

We have an **opening on the Architectural Review Committee** (ARC). The duties include overseeing the review process for homeowners' applications, ensuring the installation was properly completed and making sure all requirements were met.

Some gardening tips to get a head start from University of Florida

Annuals/Bedding plants: Create a display of fall colors with cool-season plants. Some examples include pansy, viola, snapdragon, dianthus, cape daisy, and alyssum.

Bulbs: Many bulbs like to get their start in cool weather. Bulbs to plant this month include amaryllis, crinum, and daylily.

Herbs: Continue planting herbs from seeds or plants. A wide variety of herbs prefer cool, dry weather, including cilantro, parsley, sage, and thyme.



Vegetables: Continue planting cool-season crops, such as beets, broccoli, cabbage, carrot, kale, and lettuce.

Answers to our turkey quiz

- 1. Turkeys are born on the ground. During the first two weeks, they will start exploring tree branches. At two weeks, they will make their nest in the trees and will never return to the ground to sleep again except when hatching eggs.
- 2. Hens lay their first eggs generally at one year old in the Spring. They average 9 to 13 eggs but can lay as much as 28.
- 3. Turkeys like variety in their diet. What they eat depends somewhat where they live (FL, GA, NC, etc.) and how available is the food. Diet: acorns, wild black cherries, dogwood, seeds, wild grapes, clover and so much more.
- 4. You could eat a wild turkey but you won't like it at all. Domestic turkeys are what we eat. Both are different in many way.
- 5. Turkeys are very melodious and start making noises when they are in the egg. They make at least 12 noises with sub-noises. Some common noises include: Tree Yelp (you hear in the morning); Plain Lost Yelp; a Cackle; Alarm Putt; and the good old Gobble.
- 6. Have you named a turkey? My favorite turkey is Slingshot because she's fast and can turn on a dime. So go ahead and name that turkey! **Ten bonus points if you email me your turkey's name:** gaildchoa@gmail.com
