The Board is happy to announce that we closed out the annual spending budget well within the Budget for 2023. We are proud of this accomplishment while also fixing many issues that needed maintenance. There were many audits on spending and vendor <u>costs saving close to \$40k</u>. Reductions by changing vendors, repairing water leaks, changing electrical usage to timers, downsizing the clubhouse dumpster and more.

In 2023, we added the awesome Community Garden, the Butterfly Garden, resealed the parking lot, repaired the berm irrigation, installed a new well at the recreational area. We were able to add a new managed website that will be upkept monthly. The board heard the owners frustrations regarding communication and with the loss of the door to door newsletter. 



<u> raffic Issues</u>

South Williamsburg had a lane removal study, <u>proposing a reduction from two lanes</u> on one lane in each direction on Orangewood Boulevard South of Central FI Parkway to Deer Creek making it a single lane in each direction.

What is being proposed?

Remove 2 lanes on Orangewood Blvd making it 1 lane in each direction. Convert outside (removed) traffic lanes to 2 protected bicycle lanes Install 4 Speed Cushions & 2 mini-roundabouts

Lower speed limit from 40 to 35 mph

Potential Impact

Decreased emergency response time Potential impact on property values Increased congestion on Orangewood Blvd.

Rezoning Issues

There is a rezoning proposal for south of Deer Creek that could result In <u>5300 new houses to be built</u>. The area is south of DCV behind the Sunshine Elementary School and we are the only affected village on the green belt. The environmental impact includes flooding during the rainy season to



control street flooding. Also the displaced animals from construction will all be orced to move north which means they and other animals will be crossing dangerous roads.

Animal Corner — Winter Migration Top Five in Florida

Manatees

Probably Florida's most famous winter wanderer, manatees can be found in Florida year-round Manatees seek out springs where they can stay warm as the water is near 72 degrees all year. Without warm, essential spring water, many manatees would freeze,

Snook

Snook migrate each winter from offshore to warmer inland waters. Like manatees, they're sensitive to the cooler temperatures, and the colder it gets, the more snook will swim inland.

Sandhill Cranes

Tall and loud, sandhill cranes are pleasing to see when they travel to Florida. While some remain in the state year-round, most migrate here during the winter. Keep an ear out for their bugling call, a distinct clue that these cranes are nearby.

North Atlantic Right Whale

Every winter, North Atlantic Right whales return to the waters of eastern Florida and Georgia, which is the only known place where they give birth to their young.

One of the rarest whales in the world due to overhunting in the past, North Atlantic right whales today are threatened by boat strikes. Watch for whales if you get out on the water this winter.

Hoary and Eastern Red Bats

Hoary and Eastern red bats from north will fly south for the winter, Both species tend to be solitary rather than flocking together and they usually rest in trees. They're both voracious eaters, and their favorite meals are insects, including mosquitoes.
